The bidder is bidding their margin of markup over the rack price for the delivery location they specify. If fuel prices increase or decrease, the price is adjusted accordingly, but the margin as bid must remain the same.

2015 Washington Statewide NIBRS Profile

Facts at a Glance

- The total population for the State of Washington is **7,063,070**; the NIBRS agencies' population sub-total is **5,973,820**.
- In 2015, there were **207** agencies that reported two consecutive years of NIBRS data. Of these agencies, there were **343,740** Group A offenses reported in 2015; compared to **375,105** Group A offenses reported in 2014. This resulted in a *decrease* of **-0.4%** in Group A offenses reported.
 - In 2015, Crimes Against Persons showed an *increase* of **3.1%** with **75,318** offenses reported; compared to 2014 offenses reported of **73,046**.
 - In 2015, Crimes Against Property showed an *decrease* of **-1.6%** with **274,583** offenses reported; compared to **279,002** offenses reported in 2014.
 - In 2015, Crimes Against Society showed an *increase* of **3.4%** with **23,839** offenses reported; compared to **23,057** offenses reported in 2014.
- Group A offenses were cleared by arrest or exceptional means **29.28%** of the time.
- The crime rate (per 1,000 in population) for Group A offenses was **65.0**.
- The total arrest rate per 1,000 was **26.7**.
- Juveniles comprised of **7.9%** of the total arrests.
- Domestic Violence offenses made up **52.4%** of all Crimes Against Persons.
- A total of **23,485** persons were arrested for DUI, including **128** juveniles.
- A total of **282** hate crime incidents were reported.
- There were a total of **1,228** assaults on law enforcement officers and **no** officers killed in the line of duty*.
- Full-time law enforcement employees totaled **15,092**; of these **10,738** were commissioned officers*.



Data from the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is collected from this agency. NIBRS provides greater detail and more offenses than Summary Reporting. With NIBRS, unlike Summary, all offenses within an incident are reported rather than just the most serious offense.





Burglaries decline in Grandview, statistics show

But vehicle thefts increased slightly in 2016

GRANDVIEW — A stronger presence in the community is helping the city reduce burglaries.

There were 40 breakins last year, compared to 60 in 2015, 79 in 2014, 89 in 2013 and 105 in 2012, records show.

"We had a fuller complement of road officers compared to last year," Police Chief Kal Fuller said. "They were able to provide more consistent road coverage, which always helps with that type of crime."

Assaults are also on the decline, mirroring a county-wide trend.


There were 61 reported in

2016, a third less than 2015's 93. Prior to last year's drop, the number of assaults were consistent — 85 in 2014, 92 in 2013 and 90 in 2012, records show.

"I don't know there are major influences that we can claim, other than just regular routine patrol and response to lower level calls that keep them from growing into larger calls," Fuller said. But there are some crimes trending upward. They include vehicle thefts, up from 20 each of the past two years to 34 in 2016.

That's the highest number of car thefts since 2012's 36 reports.

"Quite a few of those end up being idling/unlocked vehicles and are ultimately only controlled by the car owner choosing to provide a target of opportunity," Fuller said. "Despite the yearly reminders we put in the pa-

Fraud cases were also at a five-year high in 2016.

There were 30 reports in 2016, compared to 18 in 2015, 22 in 2014, 13 in 2013 and 30 in 2012.

"The fraud charges are the most frustrating. Those often are reports taken because of some type of scam," Fuller said.

"Often, the perpetrator is in another state or even another country.

"Many of these go unreported, but the ones that we do investigate have an extremely low rate of solvability factors," he said.

He offered a suggestion to stem the fraud tide in 2017.

"A general rule to follow with any unsolicited phone call or email contact is to consider it fake," Fuller said.

pers, we still have people doing it. But there is some good news on the vehicle-theft front, he added.

"I hope that in the future the technology of remote starters and automatic locks will increasingly reduce this number of highly preventable crimes." "After that subject was arrested and sent away, the thefts stopped. Sometimes, like in that case, there is a direct effect we can point to, often there is not."
