GRANDVIEW CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE MEETING MINUTES JUNE 23, 2020

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gloria Mendoza called the Committee-of-the-Whole meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

On June 17, 2020, Governor Inslee's Proclamation 20-28.4 was extended through July 1, 2020. The proclamation continued the prohibition on "in-person" meetings. However, the proclamation did not limit permissible "action" to "necessary and routine matters" and "matters necessary to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak and current health emergency." As a result, Council may conduct business on all matters coming before it; but should not do so at a meeting conducted in-person. This meeting was available via teleconference.

4. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

A. <u>Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign the Washington State Department</u> of Commerce Interagency Agreement with the City of Grandview through the Coronavirus Relief Funds for Local Governments

City Administrator Arteaga explained that on April 27, 2020, Governor Inslee announced the award of nearly \$300 million to local governments in Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) from Washington State's allocation of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding. The City of Grandview's award was \$336,000. Prior to receiving funds, a contract would need to be executed with the Washington State Department of Commerce (Commerce). Funds may only be used to cover costs that:

1. were necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19);

2. were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020 (the date of enactment of the CARES Act) for the State or government; and

3. were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020 and ends on October 31, 2020.

He advised that he was in discussions with Commerce regarding ambulance service expenditures in conjunction with the monthly service fee invoiced by the City of Sunnyside.

B. <u>2021-2026 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program</u>

City Administrator Arteaga explained that each year, the City was required to update the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The Six-Year TIP identified street priority projects and funding sources. The Council has had a standing recommendation of not adding street projects unless there was a funding source available to support the recommendation. He presented the 2021-2026 Six-Year TIP for consideration. The projects were prioritized as follows:

C. Ordinance establishing a separate Wastewater Fund

City Treasurer Cordray explained that in 2012, the City and the United States Department of Agriculture Rural Development (USDA-RD) entered into a loan agreement for Wastewater Pumping Facility improvements. Within the letter of conditions from USDA-RD was a requirement to split the Water and Wasterwater Fund into separate funds in 2020. The ordinance presented would satisfy that requirement. There would be no changes to the budget amounts. The total revenues, expenditures and fund balances for the two separate funds would be equal the balances for the current combined Water/Sewer Fund.

Discussion took place.
