Land Use:

- We are working on the Climate Element with 9 of our communities. Commerce recently sent the contract via DocuSign.

- Commerce has sent letters to all jurisdictions letting them know that funding is available for the 2026 Comprehensive Plan Periodic Update.
 - We will be contacting jurisdictions to offer our services in helping them through the update process.
- Continue to provide support with land use applications and subdivisions within our towns and cities.


Housing:

Housing was able to attend the 2024 Northwest Community Land Trust Coalition (NWCLT) gathering in Walla Walla last week. The NWCLT coalition is the largest in the United States and it is great to be a member. Staff heard from the Washington State Housing Finance Commission and updates from Commerce on specific funding for land trust models. Coalition board members and partners are here to assist YVCOG as we venture on to our goal of attainable housing by using the land trust model.

Mid-June Housing Staff will be attending the 2024 WA State Homeownership Forum in Tukwila. Agencies get to talk to HUD, Commerce and the WA State Housing Finance Commission about housing barriers and what agencies need to be more successful in battling the housing crisis.

Kresge Healthy Homes Program (focus' on mold, ADA accessibility, health hazards)

CDBG Senior and or Disabled Emergency Home Rehabilitation Program (HVAC, Roofing, plumbing, electrical, etc...)



Outreach:

We are currently working with the cities of Sunnyside and Grandview to build Neighborhood Watch Groups.

We have successfully created a new Neighborhood Watch group in the community of Grandview and in Sunnyside with their downtown businesses, which continue to grow.

Media:

We have purchased all necessary equipment, began testing for exceptional audio, solid imagery, pleasing atmosphere, started list of potential guests/topics and are gladly accepting ideas of interest in individual communities.

We are hoping to record our first podcast by late June, at the latest.

Local Crime Lab:

The Yakima Valley Local Crime Lab has been open since Aug 7th, 2023. We currently offer NIBIN entry for firearms and evidence cartridge cases, cell phone extraction, and intelligence analysis.

In the past 9 months the lab has processed close to 200 firearms and 900 cartridge cases for NIBIN entry. The lab currently averages a turnaround time of 3.32 days for NIBIN cases. NIBIN is the National Integrated Ballistic Network that links firearms and/or cartridge cases from an event to other shooting scenes. Timing is paramount for our user agencies when it comes to investigative information and the YVLCL is assisting our participating agencies to get this important information to them quickly.

The lab has also completed cell phone extractions on close to 50 devices and worked on 27 intelligence requests. By YVLCL providing these services, the user agencies can share the costs of these expensive software subscriptions and regain the time otherwise spent on these tasks back to their employees.

The YVLCL has become a central hub for our user agencies to share information and training. And has helped the participating agencies to come together to provide equal access to justice for Yakima County.

The lab is currently working on implementing their newest service, Rapid DNA. The validation is complete, and the lab is working on having it available for casework very soon. Rapid DNA will allow user agencies to submit single-source biological samples such as blood or saliva to directly compare to an individual, for inconclusion or exclusion. The Rapid DNA process takes 90 minutes and can give you a likelihood ratio that two biological samples came from the same or different source. Rapid DNA like NIBIN will need confirmation by the WSP prior to trial.






