To the residents of Grandview,

Our community is experiencing a period of fear and uncertainty due to recent immigration enforcement actions taking place in our region. I want to acknowledge the concerns many of our families, friends, and neighbors are facing.

First and foremost, I want to clarify that state law RCW 10.93.160 says that federal immigration authorities have primary jurisdiction in enforcement of 8 USC (illegal entry). Federal immigration authorities (ICE and others) do not need to notify any other agency or local city before they conduct operations and generally do not do so unless there is a life-safety threat to the local community. We understand that this lack of communication fuels anxiety and misinformation, and we encourage everyone to seek verified information from trusted sources.

We are committed to ensuring that all members of our community have access to accurate resources and legal support. If you or someone you know needs information or guidance, please consider reaching out to the following organizations:
